8. CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Mr Hill gave councillors details of a very informative book he had been reading on Romney Marsh. It explains that although the idea of Brookland-on-sea may sound ridiculous the book explains that the Appledore arm of the sea was only a mile away towards Rye, held back 500 years ago by the Great Wall which bears the road from Appledore, through Fairfield onto the junction by the Woolpack and from there across the fields towards Camber. The author explains that this was a remarkable feat of engineering, accomplished by human endeavour, using hand tools and working long days, sometimes into the night to prevent the encroachment of the sea.

Many of the lanes and roads on which we travel today are on similar embankments, built for the same reason, unfortunately, unlike the Dutch who maintain their dikes, which is how they refer to similar structures, we have allowed our 'walls' to sink and deteriorate, a foolish attitude for which a terrible price may one day be paid.

The Environment Agency is committee to an on-going multi-million pound sea defence scheme from Sandgate to Cliffs End at Fairlight to protect the 27000 hectare Grade 3 Flood Zone, which is the Romney Marsh. Access and egress will be a vital issue in a major flood event and it is therefore extremely important that the lanes and by-ways connecting isolated communities are maintained to a sufficient standard to make this possible and the reason behind the Parish Councils continuing drive to have repair work done. An example is the extensive repair work recently carried out in Salters Lane.
